synopsis

When in the second half of February the first news arrived in Milan that Covid-19 had chosen the surroundings of the city to make its appearance in Europe, no one could imagine how much and how our lives would quickly change.

Our city was at the peak of its international projection, as one of the most vibrant metropolises in the world, capable of attracting attention, investment and humanity from the entire planet.

Before the lockdown was finally declared, MIR Cinematografica together with other Milanese realities, namely Milano Film Festival, AIR3 Italian Directors Guild, NABA, Nuova Accademia di Belle Arti di Milano, PROXIMA MILANO and Operà Music, launched a call to action, open to all audio-visual professionals operating at different levels in the filmmaking industry. 57 filmmakers have responded by sending observational, reflexive and intimate contents according to their own artistic visions.

The idea behind the documentary consists in composing a mosaic of filmmakers' gazes, who are not mere observers of the emergency; the collective challenge is to go beyond the mere surface of things by offering personal readings of their reality and a new meaning to the events in their very becoming.

the filmmakers

The authors involved are 57. All boast a different expressive strength, experiences, languages, genres, and professional status. Filmmakers who have made important films, directors of fiction for the television primetime, observation documentarists and directors of the cinema of reality, authors of satirical strips for the web of great popularity, young filmmakers of the boundless galaxy of the Milanese audiovisual industry: They all share their view of the city, by trying to pierce the painful crust of reality to deliver their personal gaze on the present.

MIR Cinematografica is an independent production company, founded in Milan in 2005, that releases creative documentaries and films by some of the most interesting filmmakers on the Italian scene, working with major national and foreign partners, networks and international platforms, with the support of private investors and national and European public funding. MIR productions have been presented and received awards at official selections in Venice, Cannes, Berlin and Locarno. In 2016, LIBERAMI by Federica Di Giacomo was awarded the Leone as "Best Film" at the Horizons Com-

petition of the 73rd Venice Film Festival, nominated for the David di Donatello and shortlisted at the European Film Award/EFA European Oscars. Alina Marazzi's films and documentaries have won numerous prizes in Italy and abroad, with recognitions including the Camera d'Oro/Tao at the Rome Film Festival and the Jury prize at the Turin Film Festival (2012). MIR productions appear among the finalists at the David di Donatello (2008, 2017) and the Nastro d'Argento, and have won the Audience Prize at the Festival del Nuovo Cinema Italiano in Pesaro (2014) and the Vela d'Oro at the Bellaria Festival (2010). MIR is the first Italian producer to win the Focal Award (2008), the prestigious British award for documentaries intended for cinema theatres. MIR Cinematografica is associated with the European Producer Club (EPC) and Ateliers du cinéma europeén (ACE). Francesco Virga, Senior Producer, is a member of the European Film Academy (EFA).
